In the event of a situation arising which is not covered by the IDBF Competition Regulations and Rules of Racing or the Championship Regulations contained herein, then the Chief Official will be responsible for investigating the circumstances and recommending appropriate action to the IDBF Jury appointed for the Championships.



COMPETITION REGULATION REMINDERS

- Mixed Crew requirements refer CR2.1.3
- Double rostering (competitors in more than one racing class) refer CR2.2.2 Team Managers are
 advised that no allowance will be made in the Race Program for any competitors who are double
 rostered. Crews with double rostered competitors (and this includes drummer and helms) are advised
 that in the event of 'back-to-back' racing arising, races will not be delayed.
 - For example, athletes cannot race in both Premier mixed standard boat and Premier mixed small
 200m
 - Athletes can race in Premier Mixed standard boat and Premier Women or Open standard or small boat

Note: 'athletes' includes drummers and helms

- Crew numbers refer to CR3.1
- National representation and country of residence refer CR4.1/CR4.2

A REMINDER OF THE AGE REGULATIONS

- Junior $A 13^{th}$ to 18^{th} birthday falls in the year of the competition (drummer and paddlers)
- 24 and under 12th to 24th birthday falls in the year of the competition
- Premier Class No Age Limit
- Senior $A 40^{th}$ or later birthday falls in the year of the competition (helm and paddlers)
- Senior B 50th or later birthday falls in the year of the competition (helm and paddlers)
- Senior C 60th or later birthday falls in the year of the competition (helm and paddlers)

Note: All age groups, ages shown above are as at 31st December 2023 / Year of competition is 2023.

Seedings for the 2000m standard boats will be based on day 1, 1000m results. 2000m small boats will be seeded as best as possible on known performance.



CREW LISTS

All Crew Lists showing the competitors and reserves who will be racing in a particular competition class should be submitted by the team manager to the Race Administration, preferably at the Team Managers meeting.

Crew Lists <u>MUST</u> be printed from the IDBF Registration System as it will improve clarity, pin numbers and bar codes are automatically provided. This facility is available after team named lists have been entered online at https://idbfchamps.org/idbf.

Please be aware that the registration system for preparing Crew Lists does not include the rules of the crew composition. It is the responsibility of the team manager to ensure that each crew complies with the relevant rules.

Team Managers <u>must</u> submit Crew Lists at the Team Managers Meeting or to Race Administration at the end of each day for the next day's racing. This will allow the Race Officials to process the Crew Lists in sufficient time for the following day. In exceptional cases only, Crew Lists will be accepted up to 1 hour prior to the first race of the day.

Once racing commences, requests for changes to Crew Lists will only be accepted if they relate to a medical condition accepted by the Chief Officials. In all other circumstances, a change will have to be made through the use of another athlete already on the submitted Crew List. Athletes do not need to be nominated as drummer, helm or reserves as long as their name appears as one of the 26 or 14 named competitors.

Only those competitors shown on the Crew List will be permitted to race in that particular Competition Class.

Checking of crews by Race Officials will be done using the Crew Lists and Accreditation ID Cards.

Fit to Race (CR8.7.1) / R3.11)

You are reminded that when signing the Crew List, the person signing confirms with the Chief Official that all the competitors shown on the list are fit to race. This statement covers not just the physical ability of the competitors to undertake the race concerned but it also means that the signatory is confirming that there are no known medical reasons why those listed should not compete during the whole period of Championships.

If there is concern with regards to an athlete's health, it is recommended Team Managers request athletes provide a medical certificate signed by a qualified doctor stating that there is no known medical reason why they should not compete in the Championships and are physically fit. **This is particularly relevant to all Senior and Junior competitors.**

IDENTIFICATION OF ATHLETES - Personal Identity Number (PIN)

Refer CR9.9. At an IDBF Championship each competitor will be allocated a Personal Identity Number (PIN) by the IDBF. This PIN shall be recorded on an identity document (Accreditation Card) with a photograph, provided by the competitor in advanced of the competition and entered on to the IDBF World Championship database. The identity document (Accreditation Card) must be carried by all competitors during the competition.

WADA DRUG TESTING

Athletes will be selected for random drug testing by PIN number.

RACING VEST NUMBERS – refer CR9.9.2

Each athlete when racing, will show a Vest Number. The Racing Vest Number is not the same as the PIN. The Vest Number which will be in the range of 01-26 will relate to the Racing Vest Number shown against each competitor on the Crew List for a particular Competition Class and acts as a means of identification during a race.

Size of Numbers. The Racing Vest Number shall be enclosed in a box of a minimum length of 210mm and depth of 150mm, that is A5 size. Each numeral shall be of a size that will fit into a box of a minimum size of 100mm tall and 60mm wide. Racing Numbers below the number 10 are to show a 0 as the first numeral.

Racing numbers may be temporary or permanent fixtures on the vest but shall be fixed to the back of the racing vest (page 41 of the Competition Regulations for template).

Vest Numbers can be printed on crew tops and maybe more comfortable for competitors.

If teams did not pre-order vest numbers from the Organising Committee (per Bulletin 3), then all teams must provide their own according to the requirements or they will not be allowed compete.

PADDLES AND EQUIPMENT

- Paddle must be 202a and display the IDBF registration sticker and paddle license number https://www.dragonboat.sport/manufacturers
- Seat pads (cushions) shall be made of a soft material, such as neoprene, of an approximate thickness of 15mm that will compress easily when squeezed between finger and thumb. The width of the seat pad may vary in size and shape but shall approximate to the width of a paddling seat in the IDBF Standard International Racing Boat (12.5 cm) and the length should ideally, not exceed 20cm in width and 40cm in length. Seat Pads that excessively exceed these dimensions will not be permitted. (refer CR13.4)
- Exceptions to the above are permitted for Paradragon athletes competing in PD1 and PD2 races. Refer
 to Rules for Paradragon Racing (edition 1.2) for further information https://www.dragonboat.sport/rules-and-regulations

COX VOX (boat sound system)

Cox Vox's will not be pre-installed in each of the dragon boats for these Championships. IDBF recommends each crew to bring their own cox vox which can be installed and removed quickly for each race.

STARTS

The automatic dragon cups start system will be used and is the same as the one used at the 2019 World Dragon Boat Racing Championships in Pattaya, Thailand.



MEDALS & TROPHIES - refer CR7.11-CR7.13

The title of World Champion shall be awarded to the winning crew in each Competition Class on which crews from at least six (6) Nations or Territories compete.

Medals will be awarded for each racing class Gold (first), Silver (second), Bronze (third).





PROTESTS AND APPEALS

The IDBF Racing Rules concerning Disputes, Protests and Appeals can be found under **Rule 9** of the Racing Rules. **Note:** Protests will only be accepted if forms are correctly filled out with reference to race rule which teams believe has been infringed. Forms not correctly filled out will be rejected. These forms will be available from Race Administration.

Dealing with the Heat in Thailand

Before the Championship:

ADAPTATION: training in high temperatures that result in excess sweating can help your body adapt to the conditions expected in Thailand. Your body learns to sweat more efficiently and cool down quicker. The amount of time that is ideal for this is about 2 weeks, but any such training will have some benefit. Be sure to watch for the signs of heat exhaustion or heat stroke if doing this!

At the Championship: There are 3 main things to worry about in degrees of severity.

HEAT CRAMPS: This is cramping of muscles overworked in the heat. This is most quickly cured by an infusion of salt containing intravenous fluid (would need the medical tent) but short of that electrolyte drinks and cooling down are generally adequate. Salt pills are not recommended for treatment or prevention. Once cleared the athlete can usually return quickly to competition.

HEAT EXHAUSTION: athletes will feel like they have a virus. They feel weak, achy, have a headache, may be lightheaded, nauseous and could vomit or pass out. They do not have high body temperatures or confusion. That is heat stroke (see below). Treatment of heat exhaustion is resting in a cool environment; oral fluids is usually adequate. Fans, cool mist or showers and cold compresses can help. These athletes should not return to competition the day it happens, and care taken on subsequent days.

HEAT STROKE: is a life-threatening emergency! The main sign is CONFUSION usually with a high temperature and other symptoms of heat exhaustion. The medical staff must handle this. Rapid lowering of the body temperature must occur. First aid is removal from the heat, keeping the victim on their side in the rescue position in case they vomit. If professional medical help is delayed, evaporation using fanning and water sprays can help. The athlete will not be allowed to compete again.

PREVENTION: athletes need to monitor themselves and coaches should keep an eye out for problems. Paddlers need to: keep up their fluid intake, stay out of the sun, use hats or umbrellas when in the sun, seek cool places with air conditioning or fans, and wear light, loose clothing that allows airflow. Excess caffeine and any alcohol can increase the risk of dehydration and heat illness.
